Something inside me changed and I became willing for the first time to be honest with myself. I am so grateful for all I have learned through Sharing Hope Ministry and while at Patsy's Place. They had a hand in changing my life and my relationship with God! I will have two years clean and sober on September 1st and I am walking in the Race 4 Recovery to celebrate my sobriety birthday and as a thank you for all the women that have invested in me! Thank you, **Randall County Jail Trustees** and **Sgt. John Hanke** for building this beautiful and sturdy playhouse.


