Sheriff's Association Awards State Recognition to Sharing Hope Ministry

Sharing Hope Ministry was the recipient of the "Hope in Our Hearts" Award at the 2004 Governor's Criminal Justice Volunteer Service Awards Ceremony in Dallas, Texas. Randall County Sheriff, Joel Richardson accompanied Sharing Hope Board President, Brenda Blakley and Executive Director, Mindy Briggs to Dallas to accept the award.

The Governor's Criminal Justice Volunteer Services Awards were created in 1995 by the Office of Governor George W. Bush and the Texas Board of Criminal Justice. The awards were created to honor volunteers who have made an outstanding contribution to TDCJ's mission to provide public safety, promote positive change in behavior, and reintegrate offenders into society.

The Sheriff's Association of Texas joined TDCJ in their 9th Annual Awards Ceremony to recognize Sharing Hope Ministry with the "Hope in Our Hearts" Award. Nominated by Randall County Jail, the award was given in honor of the visitation and teaching programs offered by Sharing Hope Ministry. In addition to its volunteer service at Randall County Jail, Sharing Hope visits women at Potter County Jail each week. The Ministry now serves over half of the county jails in Texas, and all of the state and federal facilities for women.

Also recognized were Merrell and Doris Gilbert, who spend countless hours coordinating programs at Randall County Jail.

INMATES EVALUATE THE IMPACT OF THE LIFE RECOVERY BIBLE

Sharing Hope Ministry recently sent an evaluation form to a random sampling of inmates who have had their *Life Recovery Bible* for three months. One hundred and eight women returned the evaluation form, with very positive results. The following chart reflects the answers received on the evaluation form.

A few of the comments that we received on the evaluation forms are included below:

- ✓ I am the Chaplain's clerk here and hand out your address daily. I love to see women enjoy the Life Recovery Bible so much. I lend my Bible out all the time to help the women until they get their own. In fact, I have been without my Bible for a week now and it's tough! Thanks.
- ✓ My friend here in prison and I read my Bible together every morning at 4:30 a.m. Thank you.
- ✓ I just want to thank you for bringing me closer to Christ and for a better understanding of the Bible.
- ✓ Thank you so much for helping me get to know God better. I'm not sure that I would have been able to deal with my incarceration as well, had it not been for the Life Recovery Bible. Thank you again and God bless you!
- ✓ I think the Life Recovery Bible is wonderful! As do many others that I have shared it with. It is very helpful and made me more knowledgeable of God and His word. Thanks so much for being kind enough, caring and generous enough to share such a great book, provided free of charge to people that are the most lonely and in need of it the most—us prisoners.
- ✓ I've enjoyed my Life Recovery Bible. I'm trying very hard to walk out these doors a changed woman. I could never see the good things God has done for me. But now that I understand more, I see all He does for me. God is *good!*
- ✓ Thank you for taking time out to let us know people do care. We made a mistake but that doesn't mean we have to keep making it. With this Bible, I understand God's word. Thank You. God bless you too.
- ✓ I want to say that I am very grateful for my Life Recovery Bible. This Bible has helped me to understand the word of God so much easier than any other Bible I have used in the past. I feel I am growing in Christ and I am getting a better understanding of God's word. Thank ya'll for everything. Since I received my Bible and feel as if I am growing in Christ, on 4-25-04, I was baptized. I pray I continue to grow in the Word daily.
